

- Check for applicable Law (German Supply Chain Due Diligence Act, The EU Corporate Sustainability Due Diligence Directive)
- Create Code of Conduct and map out Requirements to be fulfilled
- Screen Background of Suppliers and carry out a risk analysis
- Detect if Requirements are met. They could be e.g., scanning for human rights risks along the supply chain and
- Identify Changes that must be done; establish complaint mechanisms, take preventive and corrective action
- Immediate Change needs to happen if you find: Forced labor, environmental damage, child labor, unacceptable employment conditions, violation of freedom of association, discrimination and inhumane working conditions in your supply chain
- Report on Company activities
- Document Audit Material and Certificates and have those Documents on hand
- Set up proper Risk management: Environmental and Human Protection measures, as not taking care of work environment can lead to risk of human rights violations
- Analyze potential Risks and take measures accordingly. (Please note, that there are potential future risks, to keep an eye on)
